We are delighted to announce we have bagged £12,000 from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative. We can't wait to see the money being put to use bringing these projects to life".


Voting ran in store from 27 February until 6 March – with customers choosing which group they would like to get the top award using a token given to them at the check-out in store.
