

Pupil Premium Impact for 2014-15

Impact:

- Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in the year 1 phonics test show that 80% of PP children achieved the standard – **+14% higher** than PP children nationally
- There was no significant gap (**+1%**) between the PP children (80%) and others in Dame Dorothy (79%)
- Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils at the end of KS1 show that PP children out perform PP children nationally in every subject as follows:
- KS1: Reading +0.4; Writing +0.4 and Maths +1.1
- At KS1 the in school gap for APS has reduced in all subjects from 2013 to 2015
- Outcomes for disadvantaged children at the end of KS2 show that PP children outperform PP children nationally in every subject.
- KS2: Reading +1.6; Writing +3.1; SPaG 2.8; Maths +4.1
- PP children achieving more than expected / 3 levels progress by the end of KS2 was as follows:
- In reading 45% (+12% above national for all children);
- Writing 36% (-1% below national for all children);
- Maths 73% (+36% above national for all children)
