Year 5 had a wonderful day on their recent visit to Sunderland Museum and Winter Gardens. The children took part in a fascinating Sunderland shipyard history workshop led by a local historian. They compared maps to see how the growth of shipyards transformed Sunderland's landscape and even handled historical artefacts – one of which was over 400 years old!

After the workshop, the children explored the museum's shipbuilding displays, learning about the wide range of materials needed to construct a ship, the many different jobs involved, and how economic depressions led to the eventual decline of the industry.

The visit continued with time in the museum grounds, where the children found the tribute to Jack Crawford. Standing proudly on the hill, they even sang his famous song to honour Sunderland's hero.
